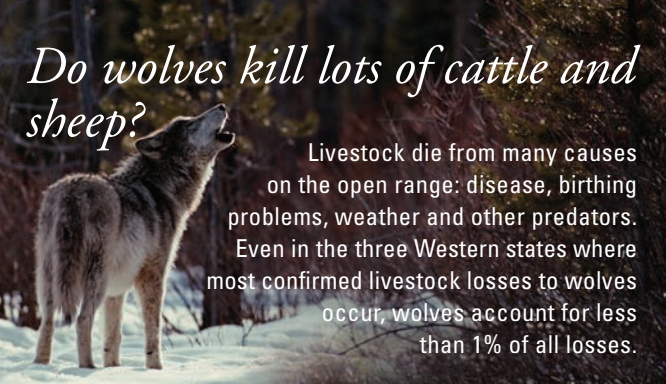

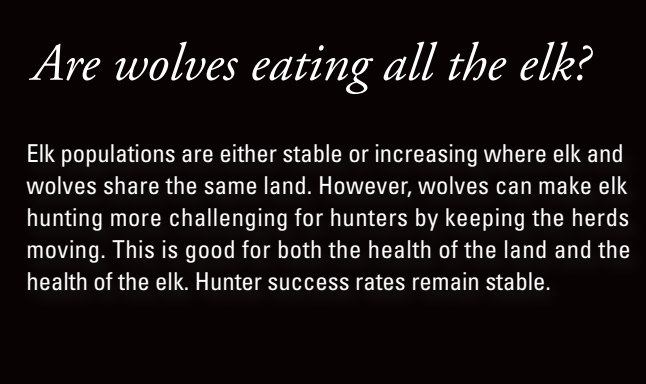
Fatal attacks on people are extremely rare, only two possible cases in North America in the last 100 years.





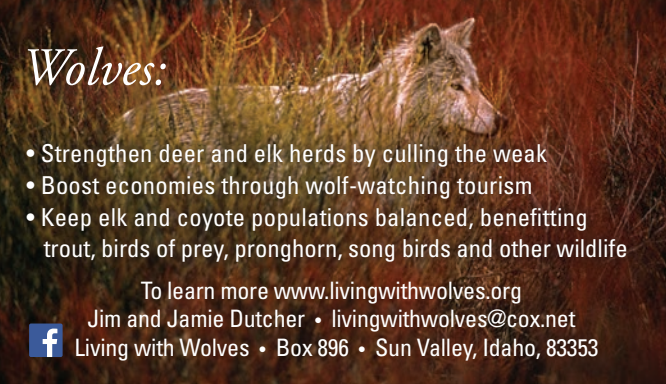
Do wolves kill lots of cattle and sheep?

Livestock die from many causes on the open range: disease, birthing problems, weather and other predators. Even in the three Western states where most confirmed livestock losses to wolves occur, wolves account for less than 1% of all losses.



Are wolves eating all the elk?

Elk populations are either stable or increasing where elk and wolves share the same land. However, wolves can make elk hunting more challenging for hunters by keeping the herds moving. This is good for both the health of the land and the health of the elk. Hunter success rates remain stable.



Wolves:

- Strengthen deer and elk herds by culling the weak
- Boost economies through wolf-watching tourism
- Keep elk and coyote populations balanced, benefitting trout, birds of prey, pronghorn, song birds and other wildlife
